#### **Message from Fr Gabriel**

This year the Church has been celebrating a significant anniversary. It's 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea. This gathering of Bishops began the work to formulate the creed we proclaim Sunday by Sunday. It is the content of this creed that is our mission, so that we may know and love God in this life, in order to be happy with him forever in the next. The creed begins with a profound proclamation, "I believe..." This is the theme for *Evangelii Gaudium Sunday* 2025.

At the heart of it all, the Christian must be a believer, to be able to say, "I believe," someone who converses with God. If this is not the case, then all our activities are futile. The most important thing we can do for ourselves and for each other is, first of all, to be a believer. Through this we let God come into the world. And if God is not at work, our work will never be enough; when people sense that someone is there who believes, who lives with God and from God, hope becomes a reality in their lives.

Through the faith of the Christian, doors open up all around for people: it is really possible to believe, even today. All human believing is a believing-with, and for this reason the one who believes before us is so important. Where were we inspired to believe? Who handed on to us the gift of the faith? This year, we celebrate the faith and belief of the Bishops at Nicaea. They handed on to us a way in which we can proclaim the truth of who God is and who we are as the people of God.

As the gospel of St John reminds us, "Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." (John 6.29). To do the work of God is to believe.

Brighton&Hove Christians Together Lecture: The Legacy of Nicaea - Rev Dr Susan Durber On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October at 7pm, Rev. Dr Susan Durber will deliver a lecture titled "The Legacy of Nicaea" at the Chapel Royal, 164 North Street, Brighton, BN1 1EP marking the 1,700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea. This historic council, held in 325 AD, was a foundational moment in Christian history, shaping core doctrines, the Creed and the unity of the early Church. What is Family of Faith? Family of Faith is a parish group for families who wish to grow in their faith. Children and their parents will learn about the mass, how to pray, the liturgical calendar of the Church, and the teachings of the Catholic faith in the YouCat (youth catechism) for Kids, covering the entire catechism over a three-year cycle.

**Who is it for?** The programme is suitable for all families with children of primary-school age. It is also suitable for families who are preparing for the sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and First Reconciliation, as well as those who have already received these sacraments and are preparing for Confirmation in the future.
