## **Message from Fr Kieron**

The prophet Amos has very stern words for those who rest on their laurels; those who live in the land of plenty and have no thought about the future. The Gospel, likewise, consists of a long parable about complacency and comfort in this life, with no concern for others; or indeed the other life, which lies ahead. The rich man in the parable reaches the point of no return; he cannot even warn his brothers that they are destined for a similar fate.

These readings are not designed to scare us, but they do have the effect of shifting us out of our comfort zones and changing our perspective. In our increasingly polarised and unequal society there are some loud voices which want to equate happiness simply with the unbridled accumulation of wealth.

Such an attitude recalls the definition of a cynic, quoted by Oscar Wilde, as one who knows the price of everything, but the value of nothing. We live by a different system, whereby a person's value is not measured by their achievements or how much they produce or their net worth, but by their dignity as a son or daughter of God. Once we grasp this, our perspective on the world changes and we realise that relationships are always more powerful than transactions and the most powerful relationship is the personal one we have with Jesus himself.

## Family of Faith - this Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> September

What is Family of Faith? Family of Faith is a parish group for families who wish to grow in their faith. Children and their parents will learn about the mass, how to pray, the liturgical calendar of the Church, and the teachings of the Catholic faith in the YouCat (youth catechism) for Kids, covering the entire catechism over a three-year cycle.

Who is it for? The programme is suitable for all families with children of primary-school age. It is also suitable for families who are preparing for the sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and First Reconciliation, as well as those who have already received these sacraments and are preparing for Confirmation in the future.
