Message from Fr Aidan



Next to the ambo in both our churches you will have noticed the Advent wreath, four candles, three purple and one pink, arranged in a circular holly wreath with a white candle in the centre. The circular shape represents God's eternity and the evergreen signifies everlasting life, while the white candle represents the light coming into the world with Jesus' birth.

This Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, we will light the pink candle and our liturgy will have a more joyful tone, rose vestment rather than purple, can be worn. We name this Sunday *Gaudete Sunday* from the first word of the traditional Entrance Antiphon: *Gaudete in Domino semper* **Rejoice in the Lord Always**, words taken from St Paul's letter to the Philippians, 4:4. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice"

In the gospel John sends a messenger to ask Jesus if he is the Messiah who is to come. Jesus answers "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them."

Imagine the joy with which the blind man, the lame, the leper and the deaf man receive their healing. We rejoice at the thought that Jesus is going to be reborn in our lives, deepening in us his gifts of love, mercy, forgiveness and a spirit of service especially at this Christmas season. Can we too joyfully share Jesus' mission, his welcome and acceptance and his desire to heal? What Jesus asked of John's disciples, he asks of us also: "Go and tell others what you hear and see." We are called to share with others our experience of the rebirth of Jesus, the joy of his life within us. Let us do that this in this season of grace and bring joy to others.

What is Family of Faith? Family of Faith is a parish group for families who wish to grow in their faith.
