### Message from Fr Peter

#### Mission Council

I have been in the parish just over a month now and have really enjoyed getting to know people, and have felt really welcomed into the community. One of the interesting and exciting developments is that from last year East Brighton Parish became part of the moderated parish of Brighton and Hove. Last Thursday evening I attended an event called the 'Mission Council', which I really had no idea of what to expect. It was a 2 hour meeting of representatives from all the old parishes which make up the new moderated parish, and as you might expect the theme was – Mission. All the different communities represented sat on different tables and we were asked to reflect on what our story was as parish, and our experience of growing the community. After lots of sharing, each community fed back and we all heard what was going on in other parishes what was interesting about it was not necessarily hearing what the plans were, but what was the experience like – and what were our hopes and fears. The result was a feeling of great collaboration and friendship with the parish as a whole, and that we were all about the same thing, but each community because of its different history / buildings / personnel and experience it was unfolding and happening many different ways with different themes and priorities. The last exercise we did, and were encouraged to take back to our communities was to sit in pairs and tell each other what motivated us in our Christian faith and life, this was a very powerful exercise and was very interesting and affirming. As we left at the end of the evening, I felt that we are really taking what it means to be a moderated parish seriously and what a fascinating, challenging and rewarding experience it will be for all of us in the future.
